While striving for academic success in the classroom, the pupils at Menzies High School Science College also gain so much from the wide range of extra curricular experiences that are offered to our pupils. Here is just a short list of life experiences to remember.

Residential

Each Year group 7-13 has at least one residential experience: Outdoor and Adventurous Activities; Team Building; Foreign Exchange trips; Educational visits to Europe and New York!

Workshops

Staff arrange these to support the learning in a variety of subjects: How to revise; How do you prefer to learn; Theatre Studies and Backstage Work; Sports Coaches; Examination Markers guide to answering exam questions; Drugs and Alcohol; Being Healthy; Staying safe on the roads; CSI Science days.

Guest speakers

Often staff will arrange for individuals to deliver presentations and work alongside our pupils to support specific aspects of the course: local business and commerce; national retail outlets; local factories; Wolverhampton University; writers; poets and theatre groups.

Day visits

These are arranged during the academic year to support aspects of work studied in the classroom through our Curriculum Enrichment Days.

This is a day where fun trips are arranged and led by staff for pupils to relax and enjoy themselves. Recent places/activities have included: Alton Towers; Drayton Manor; Manchester United Football Ground; Cooking; Sports activities; Mountain climbing; Rock climbing; Arts and crafts.
